In the last few decades the study of social identity has become core to comparative politics and comparative sociology. Constructivism and the idea that identities can be activated and changed over time are now widely accepted within these fields. This has motivated the study of the reasons why change occurs. Social identity is also a relevant independent variable affecting individual attitudes and behavior and the strategies of political actors.

This workshop gathers a number of researchers working on the origins and consequences of ethnic, national, and racial identity. The papers presented in the seminar include comparative and case studies and make use of different methodologies.

Each session will consist of a very brief 5-minutes presentation, followed by a 10-minutes reply by a discussant and 30-minutes of group discussion. The papers will be posted at <http://www.ainagallego.org/identity.html>
